

Memorandum: Solutions voter data

AIR340B Coalition Morning Consult Poll – March 2021

- 90% of Americans say safety net hospitals in their communities are important.
- 80% of Americans support the 340B program.
- The strong majority of voters say, based on what they know, it is important to update the 340B drug discount program so it works better for patients (86%), with over half saying it is very important (58%).

Morning Consult Internal Tracking Poll – February 2021

- 80% of Americans support strengthening the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to review and get generic prescription medicines to market faster to increase competition and lower costs.
- 80% of Americans support requiring Medicare Part D insurance plans to set a maximum limit for what seniors pay out-of-pocket for prescription medicines each year, in order to protect seniors from catastrophic costs.
- 74% of voters support requiring health insurance companies to be more transparent about what drugs are covered and what patients will pay out-of-pocket for prescription medicines.
- 82% of Americans support requiring health insurance companies to pass along to patients more of the discounts on prescription medicines they negotiate with pharmaceutical companies.
- 82% support giving health insurers more incentives to keep costs of health plans manageable for people who are sick and take prescription medicines.
- 82% support placing a cap on the amount health insurers can make patients pay out for deductibles, copays and other out-of-pocket costs according to a poll by Morning Consult

Public Opinion Strategies Tracking Poll – December 2020

- The majority of Americans (86%) agree the industry has made good progress in the search for a coronavirus treatment or vaccine.
- 87% of Americans agree the coronavirus pandemic has shown the important role drug companies have in research and development for discovering new treatments, cures and vaccines.

Morning Consult Internal Tracking Poll – November 2020

- 78% of Americans believe government should work more closely with the pharmaceutical industry to develop treatments and a vaccine for the coronavirus.
- 69% of voters agree the problem of health coverage getting more expensive and covering less is a larger problem than prescription drugs getting more expensive and harder to afford according to a Morning Consult survey.

Morning Consult Internal Tracking Poll – October 2020

- 87% of voters want to ensure that insurance coverage applies when you need it versus paying hundreds or thousands of a deductible first before coverage kicks in.
